Self Care Skills

Wiping self in bathroom
Washing hands
Putting on coat
Putting on shoes
Blowing nose
Covering mouth when
 coughing, sneezing
Putting projects in cubbies
Help clean up classroom and snack table
Sorting out toys in proper place

Social Skills

Having another adult other than
 parents as the leader
Obeying teachers / authority figures
Sharing of toys cooperatively
Help clean up classroom
Taking turns to visit with others
Being patient for their turn
Can sit still during short (5minutes)
 circle times, stories
Taking turns / sharing
Learning manners, being polite
Speaking kindly to one another
Standing in line
Respect to God, adults and others
Giving and receiving forgiveness
Learning to use words to express
 frustration, love, etc.

Emotional Skills

Works independently
Can "share" adults attention
Demonstrates adjustment to school
Expresses frustration in appropriate
 ways
Can deal with changes easily
